As an introduction to our topic, we will be:

- Looking at old photographs of Bilston in the past and inferring from what we can see– What Bilston was like in the past?

In English we will be exploring and creating:

In Mathematics we will be:

Developing a deeper understanding of place value.

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In Science we will be:
