





Tom's job is to look out for the pirates, he sits on the hill and rings his bell when he sees them coming so that the villagers can run and hide. There is an interesting twist at the end of this story and things aren't exactly what they seem!

The pirates in this story are searching for a different sort of treasure, they're looking for the 'pants of gold'! This story always makes us giggle!

Supertato to the rescue! When the Evil Peas escape from the freezer and cause chaos, the vegetables in the supermarket call for Supertato.

'He seems quite ordinary, he looks like me or you but in fact he's a superkid and there's nothing he can't do!'

Superworm is super long, Superworm is super strong. Watch him wiggle, see him squirm, Hip hip hooray for Superworm! Superworm is an unlikely hero but he helps other creatures every day. One day he finds that he needs a hero (or two) of his own.

The Covid-19 pandemic has taught us that there are real superheroes living amongst us. Dr. Ranj has written this book teaching us all about people who do important jobs in our community.

We will look at images of pirates and think about what a pirate is and why they are 'villains', using non-fiction texts to find out about pirates in the past. We will look at the features of a pirate, creating our own pirate hats, telescopes and eye patches and using these in our play.

We will continue our work on map reading, using positional and directional language to navigate around a pirate map.

As we read this story, we will look at the importance of healthy eating as part of keeping ourselves fit and well. We will learn about the foods that are good for us and those that we should eat in smaller amounts.

We will be thinking about ourselves as 'superkids' – What makes us special? What are we really good at?

Superworm helps Baby Toad to cross the road. We will be learning about road safety this week, finding out how we can stay safe as a pedestrian.

We will look at different occupations and think about what these people do to help us.

X marks the spot! We will be learning simple map reading skills to find the pirates' treasure!

We will be exploring treasure made from different materials. We will explore metal as a material and describe it. We have metal detectors in Reception and we will use them to help us to locate coins in the outdoor area.

We will follow a simple recipe to create a healthy, tasty snack such as vegetable soup or a fruit smoothie.

Superkid helps other people. How can we help each other? When might someone need us to help them?

Worms are interesting creatures that have an important job to do. We will learn more about worms and create our own wormery to see the wonderful work that they do!

We will think about people doing jobs in our community as superheroes and think about what is their 'superpower'. How have some of these people helped us?

We will be thinking about what makes something 'treasure'. What is special or important to us? Does it have to be worth a lot of money to be special?

We will explore pattern as part of our work on this story, using pants to create repeating patterns of 2 or more designs.

We know that we buy our vegetables from the supermarket but where do they come from? We will learn about how vegetables grow and even have a go at planting our own vegetables!

We will be drawing on our knowledge of superheroes. Exploring comic strips with different superheroes saving the day. We will think about some of the language used in comic strips and how it is displayed.

There are lots of minibeasts in this story. We will explore our school grounds to find some of the minibeasts that live there. We will observe and describe the creatures, thinking about why they choose to live where they do.

We will learn about 'Safer Strangers', people who can help us if we get lost or are in trouble.

Pirates use a telescope to see things that are far away. We will be looking at different places through a telescope lens and describing them, describing and
