Reception thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Severn Valley Railway learning about steam engines and how they have developed over time to help us transport across the country.



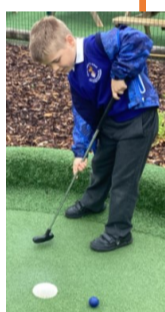
### 100% Attendance trips
